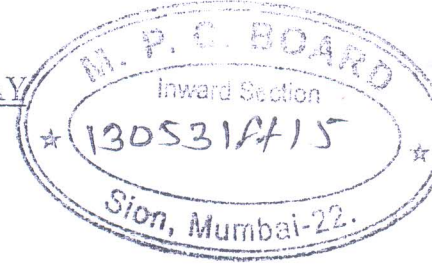

Petitioners have approached this Court questioning the power with respondent no.2 Maharashtra Pollution Control Board to regulate use of transport vehicles for carrying minerals. Submissions of Shri Mandlekar, learned Counsel for petitioners is, the power, because it is about transport of minerals and because of impact on environment, is with Central Government.

Mrs. Dangre, the learned Additional Government Pleader is disputing this.

Shri Sanyal, learned Counsel for respondent Pollution Board submits that as per the reply and stand of the Board therein, the power is with Central Government, however, he further adds that the measures suggested, have been placed before the Central Government for its due consideration and the directions issued are still not implemented.
