1. The consent is granted for a period from commissioning of the unit or Five years whichever is earlier
2. The proposed capital investment of the industry is Rs. 8.2 Crs. (As per undertaking submitted by industry) The total capital investment of the industry is Rs 104.91 crs + Rs 8.2 crs = Rs 113.1 crs
3. The Consent is valid for the manufacture of the products which are proposed for C to E. (Change in product mix)

4. **Conditions under Water (P&CP), 1974 Act for discharge of effluent:**  
There shall not be any increase in trade effluent and domestic effluent due to proposed expansion.
5. **Conditions under Air (P& CP) Act, 1981 for air emissions:**  
There shall not be any increase in air emissions due to proposed expansion. Existing utilities shall be used.
6. **Conditions about Non Hazardous Wastes:**  
There shall not be any increase in Non-Hazardous Wastes due to proposed expansion.
7. **Conditions under Hazardous Waste (MH & TM) Rules, 2008 for treatment and disposal of hazardous waste:**  
There shall not be any increase in Hazardous Wastes due to proposed expansion
8. The Board reserves the right to review, amend, suspend, revoke etc. this consent and the same shall be binding on the industry.
9. This consent should not be construed as exemption from obtaining necessary NOC/permission from any other Government authorities.
10. This consent is issued in accordance with MoEF, Govt of India circular dated December 14, 2006 stating that in cases of change of product-mix changes in the quantities or the numbers of product may be allowed without E.C by the concerned SPCB provided such changes in the quantities of product are in the same category and are with the previously granted overall total limits.
11. This consent is granted on the basis of the certificate of "no increase in pollution load" dtd 20.06.2013 issued by ICT, Mumbai.
12. Industry shall submit affidavit that there is no increase in additional BUA due to the proposed change in product-mix on or before 28.02.2014

Schedule-IV

General Conditions:

- 1) Whenever due to any accident or other unforeseen act or even, such emissions occur or is apprehended to occur in excess of standards laid down, such information shall be forthwith Reported to Board, concerned Police Station, office of Directorate of Health Services, Department of Explosives, Inspectorate of Factories and Local Body. In case of failure of pollution control equipments, the production process connected to it shall be stopped.
- 2) The applicant shall provide an alternate electric power source sufficient to operate all pollution control facilities installed to maintain compliance with the terms and conditions of the consent. In the absence, the applicant shall stop, reduce or otherwise, control production to abide by terms and conditions of this consent.
- 3) The firm shall submit to this office, the 30th day of September every year, the Environmental Statement Report for the financial year ending 31st March in the prescribed Form-V as per the provisions of rule 14 of the Environment (Protection) (Second Amendment) Rules, 1992.
- 4) An inspection book shall be opened and made available to the Board's officers during their visit to the applicant.
- 5) The applicant shall obtain Consent to Operate from Maharashtra Pollution Control Board before actual commencement of the Activity
- 6) Industry shall strictly comply with the Water (P&P) Act, 1974, Air (P&CP) Act, 1981 and Environmental Protection Act, 1986 and industry specific standard under EP Rules 1986 which are available on MPCB website ([www.mpcb.gov.in](http://www.mpcb.gov.in)).
- 7) The industry shall constitute an Environmental cell with qualified staff/personnel/agency to see the day to day compliance of consent condition towards Environment Protection.
- 8) Neither storm water nor discharge from other premises shall be allowed to mix with the effluents from the factory.
- 9) The applicant shall install a separate meter showing the consumption of energy for operation of domestic and industrial effluent treatment plants and air pollution control system. A register showing consumption of chemicals used for treatment shall be maintained.
- 10) The industry should not cause any nuisance in surrounding area.
- 11) The industry shall take adequate measures for control of noise levels from its own sources within the premises so as to maintain ambient air quality standard in respect of noise to less than 75 dB (A) during day time and 70 dB (A) during night time. Day time is reckoned in between 6 a.m. and 10 p.m. and night time is reckoned between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m.
- 12) The applicant shall maintain good housekeeping.
- 13) The applicant shall bring minimum 33% of the available open land under green coverage/ plantation. The applicant shall submit a statement on available open plot area, number of trees surviving as on 31st March of the year and number of trees planted by September end, with the Environment Statement.
- 14) The non-hazardous solid waste arising in the factory premises, sweepings, etc. be disposed of scientifically so as not to cause any nuisance / pollution. The applicant shall take necessary permissions from civic authorities for disposal of solid waste.
- 15) The applicant shall not change or alter the quantity, quality, the rate of discharge, temperature or the mode of the effluent/emissions or hazardous wastes or control equipments provided for without previous written permission of the Board. The industry will not carry out any activity, for which this consent has not been granted/without prior consent of the Board.
- 16) The industry shall ensure that fugitive emissions from the activity are controlled so as to maintain clean and safe environment in and around the factory premises.

- 17) The industry shall submit official e-mail address and any change will be duly informed to the MPCB.
- 18) The industry shall achieve the National Ambient Air Quality standards prescribed vide Government of India, Notification dtd. 16.11.2009 as amended.
