Wani, Dist. Yavatmal, Maharashtra. The Project Proponent has applied to Environment & Climate Change Department, Govt. of Maharashtra's State Environment Appraisal Committee-I (SEAC-I) for obtaining ToR (Terms of Reference) and it is approved by SEAC-I in its 198th meeting held on 07/05/2021 and by SEIAA it its 221st meeting held on 27-05-2021 and Terms of Reference (ToR) was sanctioned.

As per Environmental Impact Assessment Notification, 2006, the environment study should be carried in the radius of 10 km from the project site before environmental public hearing and to include in the final environmental impact assessment report the environmental issues raised by the project affected people about the proposed project. As the proposed project falls under Category B1, it is mandatory to the Project Proponent to obtain prior Environment Clearance (EC) from Environment & Climate Change Department, Govt. of Maharashtra.

District Collector, Maharashtra State, in co-ordination with MPCB Chandrapur Office, approved to hold a public hearing on 22/06/2022. It is directed to conduct

the Online public hearing. The meeting number and password was made available.

The suggestions or objections received during the meeting will be noted and it will be included in the minutes of the meeting in Marathi and in English and it will be submitted alongwith Final EIA report, the written suggestions/objections with the approval of Chairman of the Environment Public Hearing Committee through MPCB Head Office to Environment, Forest & Climate Change Ministry, Govt. of India, New Delhi. It will be investigated by the Revenue Department. Appropriate action will be taken immediately as per the rules of the Government.
3)	No permission should be given to Project Proponent. The water problem of the locals is dire. No road for company trucks. Trucks pass through the roads/fields of local farmers. Plantation is not done anywhere. However, this place near the village should not be given to the project. He said that Wanjari village is getting the same amount of drinking water supply schemes as during his tenure as Sarpanch.	The answer has been given about the asphalting of the road.

Convener, Environment Public Hearing Committee appealed to the participants to present any objections or suggestions. He also appealed to anyone to submit a written statement or objection. Chairman, Environment Public Hearing Committee also appealed to the attendees to register objections and suggestions. There was no response from attendees. Chairman instructed the project promoters to answer the questions present.

Environment Consultant of the project answered as follows: -

 Mr. Amol Kumbhare has asked a question about DMF i.e. District Mining Fund. DMF goes to 10% royalty for every ton. The fund is under the jurisdiction of the Collector, Yavatmal. The project promoters have nothing to do with that appropriation.

Mr. Amol Kumbhare raised some doubts about forest habitation. The environmental consultant replied that 10 km from the project site. There is no Eco-Sensitive Zone in the perimeter. Therefore, this project falls under B-1 category and is a project of the state government. At that time, when Mr. Kumbhare raised the issue of reserved forest, the Environmental Adviser said that the Eco-Sensitive Zone is only Tipeshwar.It is 37 km from the project. Said to be long. Also, reserved forest has to be notified by Central and State Governments. The project has been set up with the guidance of the Forest Department at the time of commencement of the project. In addition, a no-objection certificate from the forest department is mandatory.

- The project promoters have made provision for the survival of the planted tree. The proposal will be prepared as per the instructions of the Agriculture Officer, Department of Agriculture for protection of agriculture from dust.
- 3) The points raised by Mr. Sunanda Reddy have been noted. Responding to suggestions on groundwater, he said that the Government of India attaches importance to groundwater. He welcomed the survey suggestion regarding the current health situation in the area and said that the project promoter would organize health camps from time to time.
- 4) Sarpanch, Wanjari also suggested organizing health camps after a certain period of time. The Environmental Adviser said that the Central Groundwater Authority, Government of India has given permission to draw 2.0 cubic meters of water for the project. They have asked for two recharge pits to ? recharge the water.

It is proposed to build. Similarly, 6.25 lakh funds have been set aside for tree planting and 1,250 trees will be planted.

- Mr. Sunanda Reddy suggested that a Coordinating Committee should be constituted, as we have proposed in the draft report under the heading 10.3. Blasting should be done by Control Blasting. The environmental consultant said that control blasting would be carried out by control delay detonators. At the time of transportation, it will be closed by a tarpaulin and transported by truck. India's mineral water policy will be implemented. We welcome their support for industrial development.
- 6) Sarpanch, Wanjari asked about the health camp, to which the environmental consultant replied that the final environmental impact assessment report would include the health camp program along with the budget.
- 7) Mr. Jawalkar instructed to pave the road. We have proposed it.

- 8) Mrs. Darekar, Sarpanch made some suggestions to keep the tree alive, including building tree guards and fencing. Yet we have done so under the Environmental Management Plan. He instructed the Gram Panchayat to provide development fund of Rs. One lakh. He instructed the Gram Panchayat to provide development fund of Rs. One lakh. That subject does not appear in the EIA notification. Therefore, his proposal cannot be prepared. He doubted that blasting would lower the water level. The central government has given permission to draw 2.0 cubic meters of water here. They have asked for two recharge pits to recharge the water. It is proposed to build. Every year the Government of India has to comply with it. If complied with, a two-year permit is granted, otherwise not granted. Hundred As suggested by Mrs.Jenekar, as it is a local species, the project officer has also decided to cultivate neem.
- 9) Responding to the objections raised by former Sarpanch Shri Shilam, the Environmental Adviser said that the company has decided on a permanent station to measure the shocks. The former sarpanch said the place belonged to the revenue department. This is a matter for the district administration. They will make the right decision. Road paving, tree planting has been answered.

Concluding the meeting, the Chairman, Environmental Public Hearing Committee said that today Mrs. Faimida Parveen B. Khan, Wanjari Limestone and Dolomite Mines came together for a public hearing on capacity expansion.

He reviewed all the suggestions he had made, as well as the answers given by the Environmental Consultant. He said that the meeting gave everyone an opportunity to present written and oral instructions and objections. Some have submitted written statements before and during the meeting.

All such written statements will be submitted to the Government along with the final environmental impact assessment report and minutes of the meeting.

Chairman while deliberating said that first Shri Amol Mahadev Kumbhare, Deputy Panch, Wanjari has taken up all the issues from DMF fund to CSR fund in written and oral statement.

Mr. Sunanda Reddy mentioned a number of issues while supporting the project, such as organizing health camps in a timely manner, planting medicinal and fruit trees while developing the green belt, and conserving rainwater. Former Sarpanch Avadhutrao Jawalkar suggested that the road from Wani to

Rajura should be paved.

But Mrs. Suvarna Darekar, Sarpanch, and Wanjari should plant trees and cultivate them. Suggestions regarding that and annual development fund.

Former Sarpanch Shri Shilam raised his issues, control blasting should be done, the village should not be shaken. All of this is answered by an environmental consultant.

Chairman read out the names of the individuals and organizations who submitted the written statement received. He said that the answers to the written application should be taken from the project promoter and submitted to the government and the concerned person. He said that Pragati Environmental Society, Mr. Vijay Pidurka former member, Zilla Parishad.

Statements have been received from Yavatmal, Sarpanch, Gram Panchayat, Wanjari, Deputy Sarpanch, Gram Panchayat Vanchari, True Vision for Environment Development, Siddhivinayak Environment and Center Society, Subhash Chandragous Foundation, Viklank Kasar. Statements have also been received from Save Bird, Save Animal Environment Society, Green Social Society Services, Sankalp, Power of Nature Development Society, Earth Green Development Society.

Statements have also been received from Save Bird, Save Animal Environment Society, Green Social Society Services, Sankalp, Power of Nature Development Society, Earth Green Development Society. The Chairman said that the answers would be submitted to the concerned persons and organizations after receiving the answers from the project officers.

Chairman said the issue of government land was present at the meeting. It will be investigated by the revenue department and appropriate action will be taken as per the rules of the government.

Chairman thanked everyone and announced that the public hearing is concluded.

Meeting ended extending thanks to the Chair.
