BMC to install sensor-based units to monitor hyperlocal data

THE BRIHANMI IMBAI Municipal THE BRIHANNIUMBAI Municipal Corporation (BMC) is set to expand its air quality monitoring stations by installing sensorbased monitoring units. At present, there are 21 Continuous Ambient Air Quality Monitoring Stations (CAGOMS) in the city, as shown in the Central Pollution Control Board's (CPCB) dashboard.

The Indian Express on October 19 started its series 'Death By Breath', which high-Death By Breath', which high-lighted the growing menace of air pollution in Mumbai and showed how man-made factors like construction and open burn-ing of garbage are the key con-tributors. In one of the reports, The Indian Express pointed out how Mumbai has only 21 air quality monitoring stations, which is less than one third of the

quality monitoring stations, which isless than one third of the recommendations given by NCAP.

The state government's Department of Environment and Climate Change also on October 27 asked all the Urban Local Bodies to expand their system of air quality monitoring. Out of the 21 CAAQMS operational in Murphai 12 are operational in Murp

Out of the 2T CAAQMS operated by the Maharashtra rollution Control Board (MMCB), while nine are maintained by System of Air Quality and Weather Forecasting and Weather Forecasting and Meather Forecasting and Lessanch (SAFAR) along with the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC). A senior official from the civic

Asenior onicalitom the civic body's environment department told The Indian Express, "We are working towards installing sen-sor-based AQI monitoring units in several places across the city.

in several places across the city. This will give us hyperlocal data that will help us in identifying some of the key issues that per-ciants to Mumbai's drop in AQI." Sensor-based monitoring units measure the suspended particulate matters in the air by using laser-based technology. This laser sensor analyses the

This laser sensor analyses the pollutants that get trapped in the oil transmission of the devices. The CAAQMS system is a con-tinuous process of air quality as-sessment, in which the trapped particulate matters are com-puted by measuring their weight of the pollutants which is col-lected in a filter paper set up in one of the inlets.

While the cost of a CAAOMS varies between Rs 1.3 crore and Rs 1.5 crore, sensor-based moni-tors comes for Rs 50,000. The lat-ter is mainly used for generating

localised data. A network of sensor-based monitoring units is being created Bihar and Uttar Pradesh jointly with IIT - Kanpur, "In Mumbai there are issues like garbage there are issues like garbage burning and industrial emissions that adds to worsening AQI. These issues are very much local and wewill not be able to understand the trend through CAAQMS therefore we are switching to sensor-based units." the official said.

mandated that all the AQI monimandated that all the AQI moni-toring units should be installed in all the construction sites where civil works is being carried out. "We have been instructed by the state government to monitor the AQI of the city at a very hyper-local level. The Union ministry is also following this issue pretty closely," the official said. Ronak Sutaria, founder of Respirer Living India, tool The Indian Express that in Mumbai there are multiple factors that contribute to the city's worserning AQI. "Suppose garbage is burnt in a particular spot in east-em suburbs, it will not affect people living in the western suburbs or in South Mumbai. However, localised air monitoring can identify the source of emission immediately and enable authorities to take action. Aaditya slams BMC: Guidelines on paper, no action on ground

SENA (URT) leader and MIA. SENA (UBT) leader and MIA, Aaditya Thackeray, on Saturday said that guidelines issued by Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) to combat air pollution is identical to the one is-sued in March this year, but no ac-

sued in March this year, but no ac-tion was ever taken.
"The guideline is exactly the same as it was in March. What has changed since? The main source of air pollution is dust. Absolutely no effort has been made to control dust from construction sites in the city. Guidelines are on paper only, no action has been taken on ground," said Thackeray, question-ing as to whether any stop-work notice or fines were issued by BMC on contractors as per guidelines.

AFTER THE Brihammumbai Municipai Coproation (BMC) issued guidelines on Wednesday to abate dust and air pollution in Mumbai, the state government's department of environment and climate change has also issued its own set of guidelines.

The Indian Express on October 19 started its series 'Death By Breath' which highlighted the growing menace of air pollution in Mumbai and underlined how man-madefactors like construction and open burning of garbage are some of the key contributors.

In one of the reports from this series, Express had pointed out how Mumbai has only 21 air quality monitoring stations, which is less than one-third of the recommendations given by

which is less than one-third of the recommendations given by NCAP following which the state government and Union ministry took stock of the city's deterio-rating AQI. Earlier this week, the Union ministry had also written to the state showing concern about the city's deteriorating AQI levels.

The state's guidelines undersigned by Pravin Darade principal secretary of the environment of pal secretary of the environment department, was issued on October 27 and in the list of guidelines the state government has asked all the urban local bodies of the cities to increase the number of their air quality monitoring stations. 'Non-attain-ment cities of Maharashtra that are identified under the National are identified under the National Clean Air Programme (NCAP) and Finance Commission shall increase their air quality monitoring stations by utilising their own resources," said the state government's guidelines. The monitors shall also be made available for inspection to municipal authorities as and when demanded," the state government's guidelines read.

The guidelines also said that people working at the construction sites should wear protective gears.

The guidelines also announced a complete ban of open garbage burning,
"There shall be complete ban

on open burning anywhere espe-cially garbage dumping grounds and possible sites of trash burn-ing," stated the state government. The guidelines stated that special squads should be deployed in every ward and taluka and each squad should be headed by a sen-ior officer.

"These squads shall visit the premises and video-graph the wordsite. If observed that these worksites a ren't adhering to stated conditions, then stringent actions like issuing stopwork notice or sealing the site would be done immediately." the guidelines read.

Furthermore, the state government has also mandated in-stallation of sprinklers, fogging machines at all the construction sites, within one month after the guidelines are issued, and have also directed that any structure that is being demolished should be cowered with tarpaulin sheets. "The transport department shall take action against overloading of vehicles, uncovered wehicles and spillage of construction items on roads and public places," it said. The state government also stated that all the roads should be provided with passed formular and discounter and with payed footpaths and direc tion should be issued to bakeries and eateries to convert their fuel from non-renewable and polluting sources to cleaner alternatives like PNG and eco-friendly fuel.
